## Colloquium description

The colloquium serves for proposal defenses for early-stage fellows and presentations of ongoing research of more advanced fellows (cohorts 2019, 2020, 2021). Presenters are asked to hand in their papers two weeks (proposal defense) or one week (all other presentations) before the presentation. Presentations should not exceed 20 minutes. In case of proposal defenses, at least one of the supervisors need to be present for the respective defenses. A 40 min discussion follows (the rule 'fellows first' applies!) where supervisors should comment the proposals.
